To provide loving care for hundreds of children left homeless after the cholera epidemic, the German Protestant Orphan Society opened their hearts and purses to build a residential home in Mt. Auburn, sowing family love stories for generations to come.

1900's

By the 1940's the Orphan Feast, a love-filled community annual fundraising effort featuring the biggest parade in Cincinnati, netting annually over \$50,000, attracting 80K visitors at its peak.



A beautiful loving home takes root on a 60-acre farm in Anderson Township. Six cottages set around a grassy lawn encircled by stately beech trees, inspired both our new name and great hope for thousands of children to come.


