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Farewell Friends Thank you for your support these 42 years!



Well, folks, this is the last of the hundreds of these letters I've been blessed to write over 3 decades from this chair. My photo has changed, a few joints are creaky, but my heart remains strong for this compelling cause.

As we enter a new decade, we face many challenges that will test our resilience, including;

- Greater numbers of children facing larger obstacles in their path toward normal development,
- A shrinking labor pool limiting the number of qualified professionals available to meet this challenge, and
- Greater competition for a dwindling philanthropic dollar.

Yes, these words from my very first Annual Report letter as a new Executive Director could have been written in 2021... even more so! **Obstacles of the 1990s seem like a breeze compared to life today.**

Until 1989, Beech Acres had mostly been known as the General Protestant Orphan Home, a 140-year-old Cincinnati icon housing neglected children. There was quite a gap between who we were and what all children needed going forward.

Fortunately, we were blessed with an open-minded board and visionary staff, both deeply committed to understanding and mitigating the root causes of modernday childhood trauma. We became a licensed mental health agency. We founded the Single Parent Center and introduced the Nurturing Parent Program for the growing number of parents overwhelmed with stress. We implemented Creative Connections, a cutting-edge initiative to improve quality outcomes and reduce the cost of doing so, for Hamilton County's 300 most troubled children. By integrating managed care practices with wraparound services, children's mental health improved. Unfortunately, we were unable to reduce the cost of the services they received.

The most important lesson from Creative Connections was a deepened understanding and empathy for the parents and guardians of these very troubled children. By truly accepting parents where they were and putting their wishes at the center of their child's care, we were able to counsel and connect them to the right community resources at the right time and achieved the greatest benefit possible for their kids.

On the occasion of Beech Acres 150th anniversary in 1999, For the Love of Kids[®] was launched. This annual conference just for parents drew 1500 attendees each November for 10 years. They celebrated the greatly rewarding and challenging job of parenting while learning from national and local experts... and each other.

We learned if Beech Acres was to mitigate the effects of the growing 'obstacles' children faced, it was to be through their parents. The transformation to becoming Beech Acres Parenting Center was underway!

We articulated our beliefs about parents: All parents love their kids and do the best they can with the knowledge and resources available at the time. We focus on building the innate strengths of parents and their children. We believe that vulnerable children can thrive in their less-than-perfect families if parents and kids are supported and guided by caring, competent professionals. And we created our proprietary Natural Strength Parenting[™] (NSP) model as Beech Acres' unique approach to parenting, which combines a focus on character strengths with the brain science of mindfulness.

While children today are facing even more obstacles than we imagined back in 1989, we are not only adapting to the turbulence of the 2020s, but we are also leading through it. **We now serve more than 14,000 children, parents, and teachers** where they work, learn and live. We reach them digitally through virtual service methods. And, we are implementing a **robust strategy of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion** (DEI), designed to improve how we work with each other at Beech Acres, the quality of services we provide to children and families of color, and the advocacy we do for changing the social systems affecting them.

None of this would be remotely possible without decades of commitment and support of our thousands of donors, volunteers and community partners. I deeply appreciate the faith, confidence, and investment of your personal resources in Beech Acres Parenting Center.

I am humbled by the passion, generosity and wisdom of the hundreds of board members who have supported, guided, and challenged me. It has been a true partnership in the best way possible.

I have been blessed with a level of passion, integrity, professionalism and humanity among thousands of staff members who have contributed significant portions of their precious lives in service of our vital mission. Their commitment, effectiveness and teamwork are embodied in Beech Acres Parenting Center being named to the annual list of Top Workplaces by The Cincinnati Enquirer for 7 years in a row! Their bravery and perseverance will ensure the agency continues to thrive.

I share my legacy with all of you.

I owe my deepest gratitude to my life partner and wife of 48 years, Debby.

She has supported, encouraged, coached, and corrected me throughout this journey together. And, she has been a fabulous parenting teammate and mother to our own three great kids. They have taught me more about Natural Strength Parenting than any book I've ever read. I am very enthusiastic about life's next chapter with all of them, their super spouses, and our eight fabulous grandkids. I look forward to lots of fun with family and friends, while embracing new opportunities for meaning and contribution in this amazing community I call home.

I have taken this special mission as far as I can with my time and talent. With deep gratitude and a joyful heart, I look forward to passing the leadership baton to a new CEO later this spring. With fresh perspectives, stellar management skills, passion for the mission, and a longer career runway, the new leader can take the Beech to its next level of even greater impact.

Connector. Risk Taker. Change Agent. Jim's Remarkable Journey and Impact

Over his remarkable 42-year career at Beech Acres Parenting Center, James R. Mason has led our 172-year-old organization through an incredible evolution of purpose and programs focused on strengthening families so children could achieve their unique potential.

Anticipating modern society's complex and rapid changes, Jim has purposefully led the former General Protestant Orphan Home through its evolution from a 19thcentury orphanage to the 21st-century parenting center it is today. Jim's singular vision led to helping thousands of parents meet the challenges of raising children today AND the creation, development, and implementation of Natural Strength Parenting[™], our unique approach to parenting, upon which all of our familyfocused programs are based.

Jim joined Beech Acres as Assistant

Director, Child Care in 1978. At that time, Jim was responsible for the planning and administration of daily operations in what was then a residential treatment center. In this scenario, Jim looked, as he always has, at the adults in a child's life, the caretakers at Beech Acres, and how they could positively impact a child's growth and development. To develop these caretakers to provide the best possible care for the children living here, Jim developed and implemented Beech Acres' Training Program shortly after his arrival and became Director, Training in 1980.

As divorce rates soared in the 1980s, the profound impact of the changing structure of the family unit dominated headlines. Jim sensed the changing needs of parents, families, and kids in the community and provided inspired leadership in founding The Aring Institute, which offered essential services to divorcing and remarried families and their children. Under Jim's leadership as Director, The Aring Institute grew to a staff of 12, serving over 5,000 children, families, and professionals. By 1986, The Aring Institute was recognized as one of the country's most comprehensive service centers for children and families experiencing the stress of divorce and remarriage. organization's history, as we transitioned from serving kids on-site to serving the wider community through a range of ever-evolving services designed to meet the needs of modern parents.

By 1989 Beech Acres shuttered its final residential cottage and James R. Mason was named President & CEO.

On the day I met Jim, I remember him saying, *"I'm Jim Mason and I'm here because I love kids and I want them to grow up in a loving, nurturing family environment".*

I had just joined the Beech Acres board and Jim was the staff liaison to the Aring Institute Board committee. He made that statement with such passion and commitment that I said to myself, "This guy's got it. Count me in on his team!"

It was such a joy for me to watch Jim utilize his passion for nurturing children's environments and his incredible people skills to lead the staff, board and clients to open this new community resource. I was with him on that journey and, as chair of the Board, was also present when it was time to select a new Executive Director for Beech Acres. After conducting our national search, I couldn't have been more thrilled to offer Jim the position in the fall of 1989.

In the late 1980s Jim's uncanny ability to anticipate the ever-changing needs of parents, families, and kids led him to advocate fiercely among Beech Acres' staff and the Board of Directors about the benefits of creating preventive services for families. **Jim believed that prevention rather than reaction was the best way to build stronger families.** This belief and this advocacy became the first seeds of Intentional, Strength-based, Mindful Practice, which would eventually grow into Natural Strength Parenting[™].

As a result of Jim's vision of the future, changes in the community around social services, and a new approach to fundraising, Beech Acres held its final Orphan Feast in 1986, ending a 137-year fundraising tradition in the community. This signaled **the biggest evolution in the** During the 1990s, Jim's leadership as President & CEO grew Beech Acres' reputation in the community by establishing partnerships and creating coalitions designed to support families in the community. These included:

- The Emergency Therapeutic Foster Care program, which provided a safe, shortterm environment for children to heal from an immediate crisis
- Care Management, a component of Hamilton County's new managed care initiative with Family & Children First Management, Inc.
- Creative Connections, a collaboration with Lighthouse Youth Services to manage the care of the most troubled children in the county

Jim provided collaborative leadership that led to the co-creation of *Every Child Succeeds** with Children's Hospital Medical Center, Community Action Agency, and the United Way. The following year saw the debut of *For the Love of Kids**, a Beech Acres Conference for Practical Parenting.

In 2001 Beech Acres was reaccredited by the Council on Accreditation for Children and Family Services (COA), having met the highest national

having met the highest national standards and delivered the best quality services to the Greater Cincinnati area **under Jim Mason's leadership.**

The 2000's saw further partnership development, evolution, transition and recognition for Beech Acres, including:

- Receiving the Better Business Bureau Torch Award for Marketplace Ethics
- Establishment of MyParentSource.com to provide parents with one-on-one help from professional parent coaches
- Expansion of mental health services into the westside at our new Glenmore location and into Warren and Clinton Counties
- Creation of Parent Education Program (PEP) with Hamilton County Job and Family Services
- Establishing our first school-based mental health services, a precursor to Beyond the Classroom[™]

In 2010 to better reflect Jim Mason's belief that the best way to serve children is through their parents, the organization changed its name to Beech Acres Parenting Center.

In 2017, after decades of test and learn, Jim's vision of parenting became embedded in Beech Acres' DNA and all program areas with the establishment of The open ended, growth-inspiring aspect of **For the Love of Kids*** bears all the hallmarks of Jim's best work: recognizing and emphasizing parents' inherent strengths to enable them to be and do their best. Jim's inclusive, compassionate nature made him a natural in helping create the vision for the ambitious **Every Child Succeeds*** program. It's goal of assuring that every new mom in greater Cincinnati would have the necessary support on hand promised to remove the stigma associated with needing help.

Natural Strength Parenting[™]. Natural Strength Parenting[™] encourages parents to be intentional in their approach to parenting, to be mindful and "in the moment" when spending time with their children, and to identify and cultivate their children's unique strengths in order to unlock their potential, build resiliency and become capable, caring, and contributing citizens.

In 2019, Jim navigated the organization through a major reorganization which saw Beech Acres move from 18 to 8 programs. This reorganization shifted the focus of the organization to meet parents and children where they were; in schools, pediatric offices, and the community.

With this streamlined service delivery. Beech Acres is achieving greater impact on the lives of parents and children, which has led to solid investments in schools, pediatric practices, and child welfare. The highly committed and talented team of Beech Acres staff now makes a positive impact on **more than** 14,000 children, caregivers, teachers, health care providers and children in Southwest Ohio each year. For 8 years running, Beech Acres has been selected by The Cincinnati Enquirer as one of Cincinnati's Top Places to Work, including a 2020 #1 ranking in the Meaningful Work category.

Jim has also worked with other community leaders to create numerous local, state and national coalitions designed to improve service quality for vulnerable children and their families. His **leadership in the community and state of Ohio has been recognized by several groups, including the Ohio Children's Alliance, PreventionFIRST,** NAMI Southwest Ohio, and Vistage International's CEO Lifetime Achievement Award.

One of Jim's final contributions to the legacy of Beech Acres Parenting Center is the **establishment of the agency's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion strategic priority**. This initiative will be a major agency focus for the next several years. The overarching goal is to develop and execute an anti-racism strategy for those Beech Acres serves, the systems affecting them, and within Beech Acres itself.

Jim Mason committed his professional life to a simple, but challenging purpose – strengthening families so children can achieve their unique potential. Thank you, Jim for recognizing the individual strengths in every parent and every child and for your relentless pursuit of pushing the community and the world forward toward a brighter and more hopeful future.

Jim, a serial social services entrepreneur, was comfortable with the risk of launching new programs and services and had the full support of the board. Several of the new programs and services were not economically sustainable, but Jim learned from those experiences and pivoted with confidence and grace. Today's Beech Acres Parenting Center and the portfolio of valued services, including Beyond the Classroom[™], Parent Connext[™], Kinship Connections and Parent Enrichment Program, are built upon the successful aspects of many programs that came before.


