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CHARITABLE FOUNDATION

Upon entering its 175th year of strengthening children and families, Beech Acres would like to acknowledge its historical roots and decades of stewardship from the L & L Nippert Charitable Foundation. Dating back to the mid 1900's, Judge Alfred K. Nippert was a prominent benefactor who supported construction of Beech Acres' Anderson campus, which transitioned more than 100 orphans from institutional living quarters

to individual cottages designed to feel like home. One of six cottages encircling the front yard where children notoriously played was named in his honor.

The L & L Nippert Charitable Foundation has carried on this philanthropic legacy, as reflected in its ongoing support of Beech Acres' Parent Connext® program. Partnering with multiple pediatric offices in the tri-state area, Parent Connext® offers

an early intervention strategy to identify and mitigate high levels of stress during well-child visits. Families identified as having challenges are connected to parenting specialists for education, resources, and guidance that promote the child's social and emotional well-being. Most recently, partnership with the L & L Nippert Charitable Foundation enabled expansion into Clermont County and helped serve 2,200 individuals through the Parent Connext® program.
