Young Moms Harness Their Innate Strengths

We are excited to be ending this fiscal year stronger than ever. With a focus on three key areas of impact: youth well-being, upstream prevention, and policy & advocacy initiatives, we have fueled real change by **building strong relationships in families and across communities** that together set the foundation for tomorrow's strong future.



A strategic priority this year has been to provide help to those not easy to reach, individuals with significant unmet needs at the margins of society who are often

underserved. Since we know our Natural Strengths Practices can make a difference in their lives, we want to be there to support the personal transformation and the systematic change essential to growth.

With this critical perspective in mind, we had the privilege of launching a groundbreaking program at Dohn's KTMIS School (Keeping Teen Moms in School). This was the brainchild of The Character Effect™ Specialist, Linda Felder, who branded the initiative as "My Destiny Awaits Me." It is a one-of-akind approach where Beech Acres coaches provide monthly in-school workshops helping dozens of young moms harness their innate strengths. Our goal has been to ensure these girls finish high school and pursue careers with the self-confidence and agility needed to thrive.

Our trailblazing work at Dohn's school is thanks to the passionate collaboration between Linda, Parent Connext® specialist, Dawn Merritt, and Beyond the Classroom™ Behavioral Specialist, Chandra Hyman. Not only did this tireless team champion and execute this program, but they also brought



in external partners such as Cincinnati Children's Hospital and the Cincinnati Zoo, supplementing the young moms' critical needs with resources like car seats and interactive workshops.

They combined fun activations like "Affirmation Jars" and the creation of strength bracelets with authentic conversations built on sincere connections. Their support **infused the young moms with renewed hope**, providing them with the everyday strength-building tools needed to flourish.

This wonderful example of collaboration across our programs speaks for itself. The proof of impact is Dohn School leadership asking us to expand our presence next school year with a request for daily on-site support. We are excited to meet this challenge. Grateful to be in the position to keep moving this invaluable work forward, we look to the future of potentially expanding to similar communities across the region and beyond.

JOURNEY WITH JANEL

Grappling with the recent loss of her brother and unforeseen housing instability, Janel suddenly found **her world turned upside down**.

Struggling to cope, she grew concerned about the toll it was taking on her daughter. In her quest for support, Janel contacted Job & Family Services to learn about available resources. She never imagined this would set motion to her most trying experience yet. In an unexpected turn of events, Janel's daughter was placed in foster care.

"My baby had never been away from me," Janel explained. Having grown up in the foster care system herself, she never envisioned her daughter having to share the same experience.

Desperate and overwhelmed, Janel was referred to Beech Acres for visitation services. From the first interaction, she could sense something different. "They wanted to get to know me before reading my file and didn't make assumptions about what happened. They treated me like a person."

Soon after, Janel was paired with a Family Specialist who began coordinating visitation with her daughter. She recalls their time spent together partaking in various activities, such as reading books and making art projects. Though Janel treasured the visits, she could not overlook that they all ended in the same painful goodbye. Battling the weight of her circumstances, she received consistent support from Beech Acres, reminding her to lead with communication and the power of patience.

The steady progression of growth started to become visible to Janel and others. Continued practice of **healthy coping skills** and parent coaching techniques were accompanied by more impactful visits. With a little help from Beech Acres, Janel and her daughter celebrated her 5th birthday together with cake and gifts. Finally, it felt like she was moving in the right direction.

Janel's strides were soon validated, as she was notified that her progress had granted in-home visitation—bringing her one step closer in her journey.

She forged ahead with one central focus: getting her daughter back. As the final review of her case drew near, Janel reflected on the various peaks and valleys she had experienced on this harrowing journey. With the judge set to decide next steps toward reunification, she grasped the weight of being able to demonstrate her newfound skills in court.

The day that once seemed impossible to reach finally arrived. The hearing was underway, examining information from service providers and all legal parties. **Beech Acres advocated for reunification, providing a detailed history of Janel's progress and positive parent-child interactions.** The court concluded its review and announced its decision: Janel's daughter was going home.

"I was happy and rejoicing. All the burning of being apart was gone and I embraced my baby. She hugged me and said, 'Mommy, you did it!' We held each other for a long time." Janel shares that what she has taken from Beech Acres is not only reflected in her parenting but through all her interactions.
