Millstone Fund Awards \$1.1 Million to Expand Access and Empower Families



In this edition of Insiders' Scoop, we are excited to share a significant milestone in Beech Acres Parenting Center's endeavor to advance equity and inclusion. With the support of \$1.1 million in grants from the Millstone Fund, we are taking bold steps to expand our culturally responsive services, particularly among the Hispanic/ Latino community at St. William School in West Price Hill. This work's novelty hinges on **transforming communities by strengthening the families that shape our collective prosperity**. The project's place-based approach concentrates efforts within the schoolhouse, offering a unique platform that intersects children, caregivers, and educators.

Building on years of collaboration and trust with St. William, our youth mental health services are now complemented by strength-based parent coaching workshops and teacher professional development to engage the influential adults in a child's life. The additional element of **caregiver support empowers families with the tools to build resilience, healthy relationships, and stability within the home**. Meanwhile, our evidence-based curriculum, The Character Effect[™], equips educators with strategies to elevate student assets and foster a school-wide culture of strengths.

A significant percentage of the St. William School community is Spanish-speaking, and more than a third identify as Hispanic/ Latino. With an overarching goal to increase equity and engagement among these families, Beech Acres ensures bilingual staff are present to provide same-language support. In addition to investing in translation devices, all program materials are available in English and Spanish to promote an inclusive hub for emotional wellness that strengthens St. William and the broader neighborhood of West Price Hill.

This work, made possible through the generosity of the Millstone Fund, underscores the impact of a concentrated, place-based approach in transforming communities across our region. Their partnership and investment in Beech Acres' mission fuels our ability to deliver innovative, high-quality programs to individuals from all walks of life. **Together, with the support and engagement of these resilient families, we are paving the way for a brighter and more equitable future for Greater Cincinnati families.**







Over the past few months, I have had the privilege of working closely with our community to create meaningful connections and provide essential support to families. Through parent group sessions and cultural activities, we've built networks where parents can share their stories, celebrate their heritage, and support one another in a welcoming space. One parent shared, "Taking time like this is so important for our mental health, and this group is helping me build connections with other families." Another said, "I haven't had so much fun in a long time. I laughed a lot today—thank you for doing this." A mom expressed, "You are always thinking of how to support us; we are so grateful."

The growing outreach from families seeking resources and support is a testament to the impact of these efforts, and I am deeply moved by the trust they place in us. Together, we are building a stronger, more united community where every family feels seen, supported, and empowered.
